### Historical Society Annual Meeting

The annual meeting of the New Glarus Historical Society was held on Saturday evening, March 11 at the Chalet Landhaus. John Colstad announced the retirements of Board members Peter Etter and John Marty, thanked them for their many contributions and service, and ended with a round of applause from the group. Jim Hoesly and John Eglsaer, recruited and nominated by Board members, along with incumbent member, Denise Anton Wright were unanimously elected to serve three year terms.

The annual financial report was accepted by the group following a discussion about paid and volunteer service. Revenue was down slightly from 2015 due to a decrease in attendance and donations. Expenses were less in 2016 than 2015, in part due to the consulting fees incurred in 2015 to evaluate the log buildings for repair and restoration. Treasurer Arn noted that not all donations specified for the log cabin restoration are included in the 2016 financial report because some were received after January 1, 2017.

Secretary provided a status update on the Settler's Cabin restoration. Michael Yaker, dba *Woodjoiners* was hired to perform the work. The contract cost is \$10,000-\$12,000, much less than the consultant's estimate of \$60,000. The variance in amounts is due to the consultant's best practice/full restoration approach to cost estimation. Mr. Yaker's estimate is a modified approach, replacing some, but not all logs as well as chinking in the building and using an approach that will not require complete disassembly and reassembly. Mr. Yaker has purchased white oak logs that are being prepared using hand tooled methods and will begin work on site in late March or April. Keith Rockett, a master craftsman in New Glarus and who has done work at the Brewery is assisting Mr. Yaker.

Following dinner, attendees enjoyed a presentation by Duane Freitag, *Coming to New Glarus on the Erie Canal*. Duane's presentation highlighted his research and photos of recent travels in New York and Pennsylvania which will be used in a book scheduled for publication in the Fall of 2019.

### March Board of Directors Meeting

The March meeting of the Board of Directors focused on organization and planning for the coming season. The following officers were elected: President: John Colstad, Vice-President: Mary Dibble, Treasurer: Doris Arn, Secretary: Ann Marie Ott.

Based on a recommendation made at the annual meeting, the Board reviewed salaries and documentation of volunteer hours. For 2017, the President will receive a \$25 payment for each monthly Board meeting. The treasurer shall be paid \$750 per year for the following responsibilities: regular mail pick-up and management; payroll for all paid staff May – October; regular recording and reconciliation of museum admission receipts (admissions, gift shop consignments/sales) May – October; regular payment of ongoing expenses for the operation of the Historical Society and Museum; monthly and annual financial statements; preparation of W-2 forms and tax forms in collaboration with Society's accountant. The Board noted that the cost for comparable services provided by an external vendor, based on contacts with two CPAs, would exceed the annual payment to the Treasurer.

All other officers and directors will be reimbursed \$15 per Board meeting, based on long-standing practice. The majority of Board members do not wish to document their hours of volunteer service as Board members or those associated with Committee work and/or museum operations. The Secretary will record her hours and collect data from Board members who wish to do so and will document hours for volunteers at the museum as a member of the Labor/Hiring/Volunteer committee.

The Board voted to continue participation in the Blue Star Museum program offering free admission for active duty military personnel and their families from Memorial Day to Labor Day. In addition, we will collaborate with the Chalet of the Golden Fleece to offer \$1 off admission coupons.

The Board noted receipt of a donation in the amount of \$375 from Dr. Fred Blum, in memory of Miriam "Mickey" Blum.

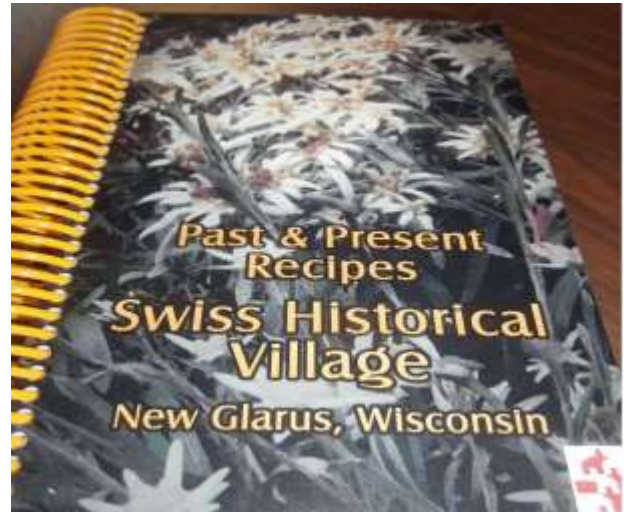
### Open House
